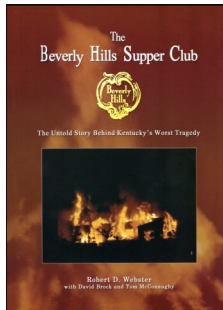

"The Beverly Hills Supper Club: The Untold Story Behind Kentucky's Worst Tragedy"

On Saturday, May 28, 1977, Kentucky experienced its worst tragedy since the great Civil War. The Beverly Hills Supper Club, located in Southgate, was packed with people over the holiday weekend. Before midnight, more than 120 bodies had been pulled from the structure and dozens more were found the following day in what was the third-worst nightclub fire in our nation's history.

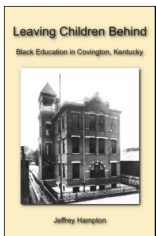
Several employees, however, had told investigators from the very beginning about suspicious activities they had witnessed leading up to the fire but were ignored by investigators. Due to one employee's unwavering quest, a team of researchers spent several years in a thorough reinvestigation to uncover the truth.

This is a detailed history of the infamous nightclub, from its early days as a speakeasy through 30 years as the largest illegal gambling casino in the Midwest - owned and operated by the Cleveland mafia, through its reincarnation in 1970 as the "Showplace of the Nation" to the 1977 fire which killed 169 people in what may be the largest case of mass murder in United States history!

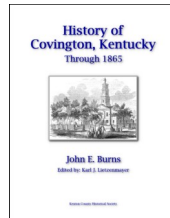
"Leaving Children Behind: Black Education in Covington, Kentucky"

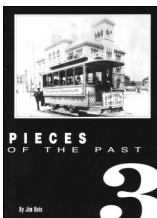

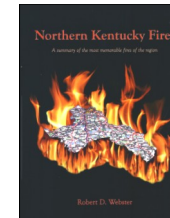

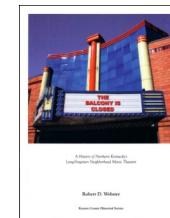


"Northern Kentucky Fires — A Summary of the Most Memorable Fires of the Region"

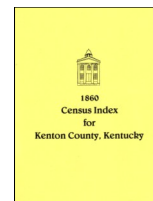
