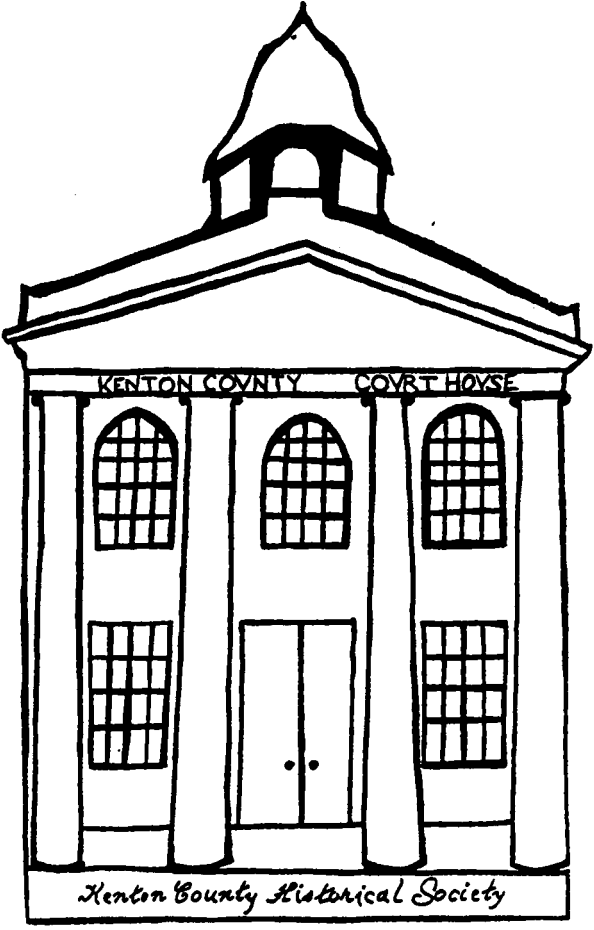

On Tuesday, September 14, 7:00 p. m., at the Kenton County Public Library (Erlanger branch), Mr. Frank Levstik will discuss...

DOING RESEARCH WITH COUNTY COURTHOUSE RECORDS.

Mr. Levstik is archives and records administrator in the north central Kentucky region in an outreach capacity for the Kentucky Department of Libraries and Archives.

Mr. Levstik will describe the availability of deeds, wills, birth, marriage, death, probate, naturalization, election, medical, and other records. Although Mr. Levstik may use Campbell and Kenton county records as his focus, his expertise and interest will not limit discussion to just those counties.

County records are of course invaluable to persons investigating family history, and to researchers in local, and regional history. THIS PROGRAM WILL BE FREE AND OPEN TO ANYONE INTERESTED IN THIS TOPIC.

There will be a brief business session before the program. As usual, this September meeting will be our Annual Meeting. This new schedule will go into effect as of September 1993: individual membership/subscription--\$25.00; student and senior citizen--\$20.00; institutional--\$30.00; professional and business--\$100-200.00; lifetime--\$150.00 for membership plus \$15.00 each year for subscription; subscription without membership--~~\$10.00~~; and membership without subscription--\$10.00.

CORRECTION

In a recent article on Alexander Greer it was stated that in 1884 Covington's population was "over 40,000" (Daily Commonwealth, 11-25-84). However, some contemporary city records give the population at that time to be only around 30,000.

THE KENTUCKY HISTORICAL SOCIETY:

With library and history museum in Old Capitol Annex, with exhibits and the architecture of the Old Capitol (1830) itself. The library and special collections hold family and county, census and tax, church and cemetery, regional and military, maps, rare books, photographs, oral history, etc. Activities include outreach, and education programs, and publications (Register, Bulletin, important books). Basic membership is \$25.00.

THE KENTUCKY HISTORY CENTER

The Kentucky Historical Society has acquired the site at Ann and Broadway for the proposed new Center which will house the library, museum, research, educational, and storage space, etc. The Kentucky History Center would also stimulate tourism because not only would displays and programs attract people. The many Americans living elsewhere but with family roots in Kentucky would be attracted to the expanded research facility. The Kentucky Historical Society (organized in 1836) also needs the space in order to protect its growing collection of records and artifacts which are now endangered by inadequate space and raw environment. Kentuckians are asked to contact their legislators requesting support for the proposed \$15-20 million bond issue needed to finance construction. Private funding is being organized to outfit the new center. The new center will be located in downtown Frankfort, our state Capital.
