Mr. Earle had a varied career in banking, real estate, and politics, including attempts to close bars on Sunday. His general opposition to gambling included antipathy toward Latonia's own race track.

NORTHERN KENTUCKY'S EARLY WOMEN PHYSICIANS (from 1875 to 1920) Mrs. Graninger, preceptorship degree, Newport, 1869, general practice. Mary Lathan, preceptorship degree, Dayton, 1888, general practice. Katherine S. Roebuck, M.D., (graduated from Laura Medical School in 1889), Newport, 1910, general practice. Jessie Southgate, M.D., (born June 12, 1875 in Ft Thomas, Ky; during WWI served in U. S. Army Medical Corps in France), Cincinnati, 1920, general practice. Mary G. Taylor, preceptorship degree, Dayton, 1890, general practice. Mrs. Louise Wade, preceptorship degree, Dayton, 1890, general practice. Anna E. Wolfram, M.D. Degree (graduated from Women's Medical College in 1895; first and only woman doctor in Bellevue), Bellevue, general practice. Carolyn Zimmerman, M.D. (Graduated from College on Medicine and Surgery in 1896), Newport, 1898, general practice. Lorraine Yeager, preceptorship degree, Campbell County, general practice (possibly trained at Eclectic Medical Institute). Louise C. Rainey, M.D., Newport, 1904, general practice (graduated from Laura Memorial Women's Medical College in 1902; she was the daughter of Dr. Henry C. Gunkel). Anna Sedam, M.D., Newport, 1895, general practice, (graduated from Women's Medical College, Cincinnati). Janet Dorothy Quinn, M.D., Newport, 1895, general practice (graduated from Eclectic Medical Institute in 1894). Mrs. Cora E. Kehm, M.D., Newport, 1900, general practice (graduated from Eclectic Medical School in 1898). Anna Wilhelmina Hageman, M.D., Ft. Thomas, 1916, general practice (graduated from Eclectic Medical School in 1914). Ida May Weslake Caldwell, M.D., Newport, 1914 (graduated from University of Cincinnati Medical School, 1912).

Sarah M. Siewers, M.D., Newport, 1891, general practice (graduated from Eclectic Medical Institute, 1891. One of Newport' outstanding women physicians; interested in Women's suffrage in early 1890s; organized the Equal Rights Club in Newport; was a member of the Susan B. Anthony Club; was the first woman in Cincinnati nominated for the Board of Education in 1911; was an author and poet and did general practice in Newport until 1925). BOONE COUNTY Gladys L. Rouse, M.D., Florence, 1924, general practice (graduated from University of. Cincinnati medical college in 1923). Louise Southgate, M.D., Boone County, 1907, general practice (graduated from Women's Medical College in Cincinnati in 1892; she was the first woman physician in the county). KENTON COUNTY Edith M. Yoder Barnes, possible preceptorship degree, Covington, 1920, general prctice. Dell S. Edwards, M.D., Ludlow, 1894, general practice (grad. from Women's Medical University, Dayton, Ohio, in 1894; she was Ludlow's first and only woman physician). Anna M. L. Furber, possible preceptorship, Covington, 1890, general practice. Sara Gilliland, M.D., Covington, 1910, general practice. Mrs. Katherine Hanks, M.D., Covington, .1898, general practice (grad. from Laura Memorial Women's College, 1896). Julia M. Thorpe, M.D., Covington, 1882, general practice (graduated from Women's Medical College in New York, 1878; practiced in Covington, 1882-1890). Mary Walker, possible preceptorship, Covington, 1899, general practice. (Dr, Poweleit also included a list of women physicians from 1925 to present). Dr. Poweleit took this information from his Medical History and his Bicentennial

of Physicians.
